BASIC SWAT (40 HOURS)

PURPOSE OF COURSE: This five-day, 40 hour course has been designed by the Quad Cities Area SWAT teams for the purpose of providing police officers with the specialized knowledge and skills needed to conduct fundamental SWAT operations and high risk police actions.

COURSE OVERVIEW: This course will provide police officers with the skill and knowledge needed to safely and effectively conduct higher risk police actions beyond the scope of day to day patrol operations, including but not limited to warrant service, barricaded subjects, and hostage rescue in a variety of structures utilizing fundamental room clearing techniques. Issues to be addressed include legal considerations, medical issues, preparation, planning and execution techniques for multiple mission types utilizing specialized equipment available to the SWAT team member.
