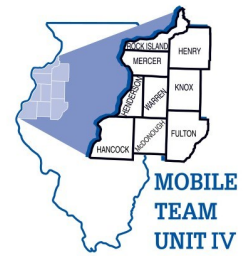

THE LAW AND SCIENCE OF CANNABIS

This 8-hour, instructor led training program is designed for patrol officers, supervisors, investigators, prosecutors, and other justice professionals. Based upon the textbook *The Law and Science of Cannabis: A Practical Guide for Legal Professionals in Illinois*, this course combines current scientific research, Illinois law, case law developments, and practical field application.

Participants will examine modern cannabis products, including flower, concentrates, edibles, vapes, tinctures, hemp-derived products, and emerging cannabinoids such as THCA, Delts-8 THC, THC-P, HHC, and others. Instruction includes visual product identification, impairment science, toxicology limitations, DUI-drug investigations, vehicle searches, workplace considerations, and evolving enforcement challenges by cannabis legalization.

Special emphasis is placed on practical decision-making through the use of real-world examples, case studies, legal updates, scientific research, and visual learning aids. Participants will receive comprehensive full-color reference guide and leave with tools that can be immediately applied in the field.
